With the passing of Queen Elizabeth II, we've seen a myriad of emotions within our communities and the world as a whole, and want to extend our understanding to each and every individual who has been impacted in some way by this event. The Queen was a constant for the last 70 years in the lives of many people globally; some saw her as a figurehead of colonialism and others saw a woman who dedicated her life to serving the Commonwealth.

Each year in late fall we take time to learn, teach, and honor the treaties that have been developed nation-to-nation. With the declaration of a federal holiday by Prime Minister Justin Trudeau in the wake of the Queen's death, we wanted to let our community members know that this, too, will be a day to reflect on our treaties.
