



Of note, individual band members can start their own small business in partnership with Sky Canoe and MFN. Talk to us and learn how you can move to the skies!

OUTDOOR EDUCATION CENTRE / OUTDOOR RINK

Funding opportunities are emerging to develop the property on Canoe Lake Road. Here's our plan:

- With successful funding, we will remodel the site to accommodate learning of traditional skills such
 as preparing hides for crafting and clothing, tracking, conservation and more. The space will be
 available for elder-youth learning programs too.
- An official rifle range is still possible. However, significant work is needed for licencing that activity. All health and safety precautions must be reviewed. Come see us to learn more.
- A new site is being prepared to facilitate an outdoor rink. Community access aims to be ready for winter 2024! A formal update will be shared in early 2024 by the newly elected Chief and Council.
- Message us if you have ideas or would like to contribute to the revitalization of this space!

COMMUNITY GITIGAN:

- Our team just completed our third growing season in 2023. Stay up to date with updates shared via the community's media channels. Also, stay in touch with the staff to learn how to get involved.
- We started on the early phases of our community's food forest project and development of the site will be a focus as we move into 2024. Come see us to learn what the spaces will offer.
- We purchased four additional year-round greenhouses. Installation and use of these new assets will start in 2024. We are looking to meet the needs of the community via the food security strategic plan. This is still a working document that requires community inputs.
- We are receiving positive recognition for our work from across the region and province!
- We note emerging interest from members who wish to explore various business opportunities such
 as maple syrup production, beekeeping, livestock, greenhouse production and more. There is also
 interest from individuals to learn how to start and manage their own gardens.
- If you're interested, please consider joining our volunteer Agriculture committee to begin having indepth conversations about how we can address local business. This helps us inform the community's Land-Use Plan (LUP) and where to focus future development to accommodate these initiatives throughout MFN's land base.

COMMUNITY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE:

To modernize and adapt our approach to business engagement and community member engagement, proposals will be going to the new Chief and Council to update the terms of reference. Some of the changes will be allow for off-reserve community members to participate in discussions in meaningful capacities while helping MFN sort out future opportunities for all members to benefit from community level decisions.




