ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGIC DIRECTION

COMMUNITY TRAIL SYSTEM:

We will be partnering with Blind River staff this year to address maintenance to parts of the trail as per our MOU agreement. In February 2023, we received acknowledgement from Trans-Canada Trail that the Boom Camp Trail network will be recognized and integrated with the existing Youngfox Road-Eldorado Road trail as part of the Trans-Canada Trail network. This accomplishment means that MFN and Blind River will be able to access funding that will update existing signage and address long-standing maintenance concerns. We will also be able to apply for project funding that adds new features and experiences for locals and visitors. Message us if you would like to be a part of the planning!

SKY CANOE

In early April, Sky Canoe facilitated a workshop with community members to deliver training for drone pilot licence certification. This project helps educate and equip newly certified community members to realize the company's goal of connecting rural and remotes parts of the province to each other via air drone technology and logistics. This in an emerging industry and all possibilities are on the table. Of note, individual band members can start their own small business in partnership with Sky Canoe to connect businesses, services, First Nations, municipalities and people across the North.

OUTDOOR EDUCATION CENTRE

In 2022, we endeavoured to revitalize the space at the gun range on Canoe Lake Road. We are still waiting on news from our CORDA application, but regardless here's our current plan:

- With successful funding, we will remodel the site to accommodate learning for traditional skills such as skinning and tanning hides. We will use the space for elder-youth learning programs too.
- The use of the gun range is still on the table, however, to get back to a state of operation, significant work is needed to earn the licence and certification to support the use of rifles and shotguns at the site. All health and safety precautions must be reviewed. Come see us to learn more.

COMMUNITY GITIGAN:

- Seeds have been planted for the 2023 growing season!
- We successfully received funding through the Climate Change and Health Adaptation Program to develop a food forest in Mississauga First Nation. This project builds off the successful re-launch of the gitigan project in 2021 and the year-round growing dome install in 2022 to address food security concerns for the community. We value our partners and funders that help us meet these goals.
- We are receiving positive recognition for our work from across the region and province!
- We note emerging interest from members who wish to explore various business opportunities such as maple syrup production, beekeeping, raising livestock, greenhouse production and more. There is also an interest from individuals to learn how to start and manage their own gardens.
- If you're interested, please consider joining our volunteer Agriculture committee to begin having in-depth conversations about how we can address local business. This helps us inform the community's land-use plan (LUP) and where to focus future development to accommodate these new initiatives throughout MFN's land base.
